Dos Corrientes, Ecuador 2022 and Beyond

2022 was a very successful year for Dos Corrientes in Ecuador. As we come to the close of our third full year of projects, it is a time of reflection and gratitude.

Since the project began in January 2020, Dos Corrientes has been financially supported by more than 120 individuals who recognize that people in developing countries want the same things for their children as those in wealthier nations. That is access to good food, good education, and employment.

In Liguiqui, Ecuador, those very basic necessities are insufficient and, in some cases, non-existent. The work of Dos Corrientes has impacted the village and much has been done over the past three years. Food has been grown and distributed, courses have been taught and employment has been provided to local Ecuadorians. They have cleared land, built and maintained access roads, gardens, structures, irrigation, fences, taught courses, and researched, administered, and distributed food among many other things. As many as 60 people have been employed in this way, even if it was only for a few days of work.
